

MOBILE PHONES – STUDENT USE

PURPOSE

To explain to our school community the Department's and Brookside P-9 College's policy requirements and expectations relating to students using mobile phones and other personal mobile devices during school hours.

SCOPE

This policy applies to:

- 1. All students at Brookside P-9 College and,
- 2. Students' personal mobile phones and other personal mobile devices brought onto school premises during school hours, including recess and lunchtime.

DEFINITIONS

For the purpose of this policy, "mobile phone" refers to mobile phones and any device that may connect to or have a similar functionality to a mobile phone.

POLICY

Brookside P-9 College understands that students may bring a personal mobile phone to school, particularly if they are travelling independently to and from school.

At Brookside P-9 College:

- Students who choose to bring mobile phones to school must have them switched off and securely stored during school hours
- Exceptions to this policy may be applied if certain conditions are met (see below for further information)
- When emergencies occur, parents or carers should reach their child by calling the school's office.

Personal mobile phone use

In accordance with the Department's <u>Mobile Phones — Student Use Policy</u> issued by the Minister for Education, personal mobile phones must not be used at Brookside P-9 College during school hours, including lunchtime and recess, unless an exception has been granted.

Where a student has been granted an exception, the student must use their mobile phone for the purpose for which the exception was granted, and in a safe, ethical and responsible manner.

Secure storage

Mobile phones owned by students at Brookside P-9 College are considered valuable items and are brought to school at the owner's (student's or parent/carer's) risk. Students are encouraged not to bring a mobile phone to school unless there is a compelling reason to do so. Please note that Brookside P-9 College does not have accident insurance for accidental property damage or theft.

Students and their parents/carers are encouraged to obtain appropriate insurance for valuable items. Refer to the Department's <u>Claims for Property Damage and Medical Expenses policy.</u>

Where students bring a mobile phone to school, Brookside P-9 College will provide secure storage. Secure storage is storage that cannot be readily accessed by those without permission to do so. At Brookside P-9 College students are required to store their phones as outlined below:

- Students in P-4: Students will bring their mobile phones to be stored in secure lockers located in the Main Office. Students must bring their phone in a sealed bag/case that is labelled. An example is a small pencil case, labelled and zipped up.
- **Students in Years 5-6:** Students will store their mobile phones in allocated mobile phone lockers.
- **Students in Years 7-9:** Students will store their mobile phones in their school lockers.

All students must provide their own combination lock for the lockers which can remain on that locker for the duration of the school year.

Enforcement

Students who use their personal mobile phones inappropriately at Brookside P-9 College may be issued with consequences consistent with our school's existing *Student Wellbeing and Engagement* and *Bullying Prevention* policies.

At Brookside P-9 College inappropriate use of mobile phones is **any use during school hours**, unless an exception has been granted, and particularly use of a mobile phone:

- in any way that disrupts the learning of others
- to send inappropriate, harassing or threatening messages or phone calls
- to engage in inappropriate social media use including cyber bullying
- to capture video or images of people, including students, teachers and members of the school community without their permission
- to capture video or images in the school toilets, changing rooms, swimming pools and gyms
- during exams and assessments

Exceptions

Exceptions to the policy:

- may be applied during school hours if certain conditions are met, specifically,
 - Health and wellbeing-related exceptions; and
 - o Exceptions related to managing risk when students are offsite.
- can be granted by the Principal, the teacher for that class, in accordance with the Department's Mobile Phones Student Use Policy.

The three categories of exceptions allowed under the Department's <u>Mobile Phones — Student Use</u> <u>Policy</u> are:

1. Learning-related exceptions

2. Health and wellbeing-related exceptions

3. Exceptions related to managing risk when students are offsite

Students on excursions and camps	Risk assessment planning documentation
When students are offsite (not on school grounds)	Risk assessment planning documentation
and unsupervised with parental permission	
Students with a dual enrolment or who need to	Risk assessment planning documentation
undertake interschool travel	

Where an exception is granted, the student can only use the mobile phone for the purpose for which it was granted.

Camps, excursions and extracurricular activities

Brookside P-9 College will provide students and their parents and carers with information about items that can or cannot be brought to camps, excursions, special activities and events, including personal mobile phones.

Exclusions

This policy does not apply to:

- Out-of-School-Hours Care (OSHC)
- Out-of-school-hours events
- Travelling to and from school
- Wearable devices (all notifications and mobile connections must be switched off)
- iPads and all other personal devices (all notifications must be switched off)
- Students undertaking workplace learning activities, e.g. work experience

COMMUNICATION

This policy will be communicated to our school community in the following ways:

- Available publicly on our school's website (or insert other online parent/carer/student communication method)
- Included annually in school newsletter
- Discussed at staff briefings/meetings where relevant
- Included in transition and enrolment packs
- Discussed at parent information nights/sessions
- Hard copy available from school administration upon request
